



UW Medicine Primary Care at Lopez Island

In partnership with Catherine Washburn Medical Association and Lopez Island Hospital District, UW Medicine's dedication to improving the health of the public is stronger than ever. Patient care is always our top priority, and here's what we provide daily to island residents:

Comprehensive care for everything from acute illnesses and injuries to integrated behavioral health, EKGs, x-rays, preventive screenings, sports, and employment physicals.

Six to eight reserved same-day walk-in appointments per provider daily for our clinical team to fill based on medical necessity. Our clinical team also determines the best care option for each patient which may include a virtual visit or other appropriate options.

An after-hours consulting nurse service for medical advice that cannot wait by calling the clinic at 360.468.2245. We have on-call physicians 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, that the nurse will connect you with if they feel you need additional assistance.

Internal nurse triage services include in-clinic nurses and a central team of nurses. Connect with a nurse by calling the clinic and pressing #2 or sending a MyChart message to the care team.

Local partnerships provide the best care possible. Part of comprehensive care includes collaborations with CWMA, Lopez Fire & EMS, Lopez Island Physical Therapy, and Assured Imaging for on-island mammograms.

Virtual primary care services provide coverage from 8 a.m. — 8 p.m., seven days a week. Our team of virtual primary care providers offers you and your family a new way to receive quick, on-demand care. Start an on-demand video visit to see the first available provider or complete an E-Visit questionnaire for certain health conditions at uwmedicine.org or the MyChart app. Care is available from anywhere in Washington state.

A fully staffed clinic with the arrival of Samuel Rich, PA-C on December 7, 2023, which also includes one physician, one flex advanced practice practitioner, one clinic manager, two patient service specialists, one lab/x-ray technician, a team of registered nurses with one in the clinic every day, plus one part-time medical assistant who always works with an RN.

How to seek care

1. Log into MyChart (scan the QR code below)
2. Call the clinic at (360) 468-2245
 - Press #1 to schedule a routine visit with your provider.
 - **Press #2 to be directed to clinic reception** to schedule a lab visit or if you have an urgent concern.
 - Press #3 for COVID-19 information.
